

# Ship's Navigation Officer

# Median Yearly Income (2010): \$78, 952

This unit group is for ship's captain and other deck officers: Deck officers operate ships or self-propelled vessels to transport passengers and cargo on oceans and coastal and inland waters, and supervise and co-ordinate the activities of deck crews.

## WHAT YOU DO

### Ship's Navigation Officers are

responsible for the safety of the ship, your crew and any other person on board the vessel. They may plan and execute safe passage using navigational aids and determine the geographical position ships using navigational instruments, maps, and charts. They may also direct and oversee the loading and unloading of cargo; and record on the ship's log the vessel's progress, crew's activities, and weather and sea conditions.

### WHAT YOU NEED

- Enjoy being at sea;
- A sense of responsibility and strong leadership qualities are needed;
- Must be in good health and meet eyesight and colour vision requirements;
- Problem-solving and decision making skills are essential;
- Have a strong understanding of principles of marine navigation, seamanship, meteorology, ship construction and stability;
- The ability to work well with other professionals;
- Enjoy variety in job tasks; and
- Excellent communication skills.



# Ship's navigation officers perform some or all of the following duties:

- Command and operate ships or other self-propelled vessels, such as barges or oil rigs, to transport passengers and cargo;
- Plan and execute safe navigational passage using navigational aids;
- Determine geographical position using navigational instruments, maps and charts; and
- Command and operate coast guard vessels to provide ice-breaking and search and rescue services.






