Specialists in human resources represent both management and employees fairly, equally, and respectfully. They deal with diverse issues such as hiring, wage structures, performance management and collective agreement negotiation, and controversial decisions such as downsizing.



WHAT YOU NEED

- Excellent interpersonal skills are essential:
- You must have effective oral and written communication skills;
- Strong organizational skills;
- Capable of analytical and logical thought; and
- Negotiating skills and research skills are also important.



Specialists in human resources perform some or all of the following duties:

- Advise managers and employees on the interpretation of personnel policies, compensation and benefit programs and collective agreements;
- Research and prepare occupational classifications, job descriptions, salary scales and competency appraisal measures and systems;
- Plan and administer staffing, training and career development, employee assistance, employment equity and affirmative action programs;
- Manage programs and maintain human resources information and related records systems; and
- Hire and oversee training of staff.




